## Part C

### Reports

There were four (4) total incidents reported to the Title IX Coordinator during the January 1 – December 31, 2016 timeframe, two (2) of which were reported as sexual violence, while the other two (2) were reported as both sexual violence and dating violence. There were no reported cases to confidential reporting options. Confidential reporting options include Counseling Services, the University Chaplain and the Wellness Center.

#### A. Complaint Resolution Procedure Outcomes

Of the four (4) cases there was only one (1) case where the Reporting Party requested a formal investigation through the complaint resolution procedure. The Responding Party was found not responsible for sexual violence and dating violence.
