## CSU Report to the Illinois Department of Human Rights and Illinois Attorney General

### Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education

In compliance with the requirement that, on or before November 1, 2017 and on or before every November 1 thereafter, each higher education institution shall provide an annual report, concerning the immediately preceding calendar year, to the Department of Human Rights and the Attorney General with all of the following components, CSU respectfully submits the following information:

- (1) A copy of the higher education institution's most recent comprehensive policy adopted in accordance with Section 10 of the Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act  
*(Attachment A)*.
- (2) A copy of the higher education institution's most recent concise, written notification of a survivor's rights and options under its comprehensive policy, required pursuant to Section 15 of

(8) The number of allegations of sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking that were referred to local or State law enforcement. *There were no cases referred in 2016.*

(9) The number of allegations of sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking that the higher education institution reviewed through its complaint resolution procedure.

*There were no such allegations in 2016 that went through the institutions complaint resolution procedure.*

(10) With respect to all allegations of sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking reviewed under the higher education institution's complaint resolution procedure, an aggregate list of the number of students who were (i) dismissed or expelled, (ii) suspended, (iii) otherwise disciplined, or (iv) found not responsible for violation of the comprehensive policy through the complaint resolution procedure during the reporting period. *There were no such students dismissed or disciplined in 2016.*

- (3) The number, type, and number of attendees, if applicable, of primary prevention and awareness programming at the higher education institution. *October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month. A key event among others during these months at CSU is a panel presentation and discussion and CSU typically invites agencies from the community to join us. The foci during these months are on sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking. CSU had 107 participants attend our 2016 activities.*
- (4) The number of incidents of sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking reported to the Title IX coordinator or other responsible employee, pursuant to Title IX of the federal Education Amendments of 1972, of the higher education institution. *There were 3 reported incidents of domestic violence on campus in 2016.*
- (5) The number of confidential and anonymous reports to the higher education institution of sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking. *There were no such reports in 2016.*
- (6) The number of allegations in which the survivor requested not to proceed with the higher education institution's complaint resolution procedure. *There were 3 cases in 2016 in which the survivor requested not to proceed with the higher education institution's complaint resolution procedure.*
- (7) The number of allegations of sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking that the higher education institution investigated. *There were 3 reported incidents of domestic violence on campus in 2016.*
