As a multi campus institution, Robert Morris has six Chicago area locations and two Central Illinois locations. Our policies and procedures are institutional as is our training approach. All of these locations including our Chicago Main Campus are primarily commuter campuses with a small physical footprint at each location.

Robert Morris University is also committed to providing resources that educate the RMU community to assist in ensuring a safe, respectful, discrimination and harassment free environment. The University conducts a variety of training methods for students and employees. The goal is to prevent sexual violence before it occurs.
